Purpose:

- MC's play a special role as they are like the picture frame holding everything together, bringing everything together. They are the welcoming team, the bridge from one thing to another, spiritual leader as they pray and share, and community builder as they share information about key community events.
- MC's are responsible to foster a welcoming atmosphere and guide congregants through the worship experience with clarity and warmth.

Qualifications:

- Strong faith and communication skills.
- Honesty and openness
- Warmth, adaptability, and professionalism.
- Agreement with the statements of faith of LEMC
- Example of faithful life in the church, community and on social media
- Able to led in public prayer

Responsibilities:

- Lead the Sunday team through team up time of encouragement, a scripture passage, and prayer. This happens at 9:50 in the high voltage room.
- Welcome congregants, give a call to worship and facilitate seamless service transitions for Sunday morning service.
- Introduce service elements and read scripture.
- Communicate announcements with enthusiasm. Ask for clarity on any announcements before service begins
- Lead prayers, acknowledge special occasions, health needs in congregation, and local and global needs, and conclude with a blessing.
- Dress code -
 - Dress business casual
 - No open toe shoes
 - No shoulders exposed
